As such, he oversees the efforts of the NCCDD to engage in innovative efforts to enable people with intellectual and other developmental disabilities to exercise self-determination, be independent, be



productive and to be integrated and included in all facets of community life. Chris has 28 years of experience working with and on behalf of individuals experiencing intellectual and other developmental disabilities and families in the public and private sectors.

With both undergraduate and graduate degrees in social work from East Carolina University (ECU), Egan's efforts are directed toward promoting respect and positive outcomes for people with intellectual disabilities, developmental disabilities, and other co-occurring disabilities.

Egan is the father of twins, a boy and girl born in 2001. His daughter was born with VATER Association resulting in numerous and significant medical complications, placing his daughter at significant risk of developmental delay. He involved natural and formal supports including North Carolina's Early Intervention services to provide supports for his daughter. "As a parent, I have a unique perspective of the powerful experiences associated with having a child born with a disability, and have benefited from the assistance of our service system."

Chris is also recognized for expertise and skill in areas of personcentered thinking and planning and for his commitment to the importance of personal outcomes achievement for people with disabilities. He has an extensive history of volunteer leadership including The Arc of the US, The Arc of NC and most recently, the ECU School of Social Work Board of Advisors.
