


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WHAT IS THE UP PROGRAM?

- The University Participant (UP) Program is a two year, inclusive program for college-aged individuals with intellectual disabilities.
- Operated as a pilot program from 2007 to 2010; 2 UP students completed the program by 2010.
- Expanded to 4 UP students in 2010, 4 additional in 2011 for a total of 8 UP students, and 10-12 students in 2020
- Funded as a model demonstration site in 2010 Department of Education and now by WCU.




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FUNDING AND SCHOLARSHIPS

- UP students pay same tuition and fees as all other college students
- \$2,500 per semester support fee
- Possible scholarship support through donors within the WCU Office of Advancement as well as outside donors
- Approved as a Comprehensive Transition Postsecondary (CTP) Program for Pell Grant and Work Study with FAFSA eligibility
- NC Innovations Funding (formally CAP)
- Volunteers providing natural supports
- Vocational Rehabilitation support (partial)



ADMISSIONS TIMELINE

Fall 2021: Interviews and Open House (late October/early November with Admissions)

December 1, 2021: Deadline for applications submitted for individuals applying for Fall 2022

January/February 2022: UP Admissions Steering Committee meeting to review applicants and notify potential applicants that are selected for WCU UP Orientation Camp


January 2022: Apply for Financial Aid FAFSA as soon as possible

March 2022: Spring Orientation Camp for the Top UP applicants selected by the UP Admissions Steering Committee (multi-day residential experience required-college try-on experience)

April 2022: Final decisions made, deposits and forms due, advising and registration

August 2022: Selected students will move into residence halls and start classes with other WCU students

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WHAT DO UP STUDENTS DO ON CAMPUS?!

- Live in campus residence halls and participate in hall activities
- Audit classes of their choice that support individualized goals
- Work at least 10 hours per week in an interested employment area
- Plus so much more!



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Academics:

UP students have selected and participated in more than 287 academic courses from ALL 6 of WCU's academic colleges. UP Students have been taught by more than 173 different WCU college professors.



More than 90% of UP graduates are hired and maintain paid community jobs working 20+ hours per week after graduation.
